In the Skills for Education and Employment (SEE) program you can improve your skills in reading, writing, math, digital skills and English as an additional language in order to help you participate more effectively in training or in the labour force. Contextualised training will provide you with training that is specific to your needs, or the industry that you are looking to work in.

Prepare-2-Work

The Prepare-2-Work short course is designed to provide you with language, literacy, numeracy, and digital skill development, with a strong focus on employability skills.

Digital Essentials

The Digital Essentials training program is designed to provide you with the skills to operate digital devices for work or job searching. You do not need to know how to use a computer to undertake this training.

Civil Pathways

This short course will support you to improve reading, writing, numeracy and digital skills in the context of a career in the Civil Construction industry, and strengthen pathways for you to succeed in further education and employment in civil industry areas.

Induction to Disability will provide you with the skills required to enter into a variety of roles supporting people with disability. Successful completion will give you credit towards a range of qualifications in the CHC Community Services Training Package, including the CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support.
